

Kitty Condos

- Sturdy Cardboard box (large enough for a cat/kitten to fit inside)
- Pencil
- Decorating items (markers/colored pencils/crayons, yarn, feathers, pipe cleaners, stickers, etc.)
- Scissors/retractable razor blade/utility knife
- Glue or tape

1. Seal cardboard box on all sides.
2. Use a pencil to trace any doors or windows you wish the condo to have. Cut them out with your scissors/utility knife.
3. Decorate the box as you wish.



Cat Puzzle Balls

- Paper towel or toilet paper rolls
 - Scissors
1. Cut toilet paper/paper towel rolls into approx. ¼” rings.
 2. Layer rings together at different angles. After about 5 rings, the ball will start to take shape.
 3. Keep adding rings until it looks like a full sphere.



Cat Blankets (No-sew blankets)

- 30” – 36” double layer of fleece (two squares each)
- Scissors

Layer the fleece squares one on top of the other so they evenly match

Cut a 3” square out of each corner

Cut fringe strips (through both the top & bottom layers) of the square all the way around

Tie the fringes (top to bottom) layers together in knots, double-knot if possible



HOMEMADE CRUNCHY CAT TREATS

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (5 ounce) canned pink salmon or tuna, no salt added and packed in water, drained
- 1 cup oat flour*
- 1 large egg
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 heaping tablespoon dried catnip

INSTRUCTIONS

1. *It's easy to make your own oat flour. Simply grind old-fashioned oats in a spice grinder (or a super clean coffee grinder) until it is transformed into a light powder. There you have it — oat flour!
2. Place a rack in the upper third of the oven and preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
3. In the bowl of a food processor fitted with a blade attachment, combine drained salmon or tuna, oat flour, egg, olive oil and catnip. Pulse until mixture comes together. Bits of fish and dry food will remain but the mixture will easily form into small balls. It will be thick but pliable and not terribly sticky.
4. Roll dough into 1/2 teaspoon balls and place on prepared cookie sheet. Use a fork to press marks into each cookie ball.
5. Bake cookies for 10 to 12 minutes until they are dried on top and slightly browned. Allow to cool completely before offering to your kitty.
6. Place treats in an airtight container and store in the refrigerator for up to seven days.

Easy Homemade Cat Treats

Ingredients

- 1 egg
- 3 oz can of Fancy Feast Seafood Classic Pate
- 1 cup flour

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. In a medium bowl, whisk egg.
3. Add Fancy Feast Seafood Classic Pate. Whisk until smooth then add flour. Mix until dough forms.
4. In between two pieces of parchment paper, roll dough in to 1/4" thickness. Use a mini cookie cutter to create small treats.
5. Bake for 10 minutes.
6. Store in an air tight container for up to two weeks.
