Each participant in the Rescue Village Slumber Party is asked to fundraise a MINIMUM of \$1,000 for the animals at Rescue Village.



Option 1

Donate to yourself. It all begins with you!	\$50

QUICK TIPS

Step 1: Choose a fact to include first

- Rescue Village is a 501(c)(3) non-profit addressing animal homelessness through humane investigations, shelter programs, spay and neuter, and community engagement initiatives.
- RV houses cats, dogs, kittens, puppies, small animals, and barn animals!
- RV averages over 2,000 intakes into the shelter a year.
- RV averages over 2,000 adoptions a year.
- RV's shelter veterinary clinic performs over 2,000 spay/neuter surgeries annually across the shelter program, low-cost spay/neuter, and trap, neuter, return programs.
- Rescue Village hosts Ohio's most prominent, public, outdoor dog festival- Woofstock. In 2024, the event welcomed 10,000 attendees and reached 3 million through social media efforts.
- RV welcomes nearly 50 tour and service groups each year.
- RV hosts summer camp for over 200 campers each summer.
- RV Humane Officers investigate 1,000 humane calls yearly including follow-up visits.
- Rescue Village gets 60% of intake animals as owner surrenders or stray cats, transfers, and through humane law investigation.

snoozing with the animals

Rescue Village is hosting the annual Slumber Party to fundraise for the animals and foster empathy by staying in the shelter overnight.

Besides providing our animals with social interaction, spending time with shelter cats or dogs encourages them to interact politely and helps them become more adoptable. You can make a difference in a shelter animal's quality of life by adding enrichment with your time, attention, and love.



For 12 hours, you will be in a kennel with a Rescue Village shelter cat or dog.

The space is not that big and likely not the most comfortable. This helps create awareness about what it's like for our animals to be in the kennel, what goes into their care, and even get a few adopted!

what to avoid

- Chocolate
- Grapes
- Yelling/Screaming
- Pulling/Grabbing
- Running



keep in mind

- 1. We are in a shelter environment, and it is stressful for the animals!
- 2. Please avoid: loud voices/noises, putting fingers in crates/kennels, and engaging further with a stressed animal.
- 3. Animal Care staff will be onsite to ensure people and shelter animal safety.
- 4. If an animal or person becomes overstimulated and needs to take some time away to calm down, please allow for this.
- 5. We are sharing the space- help keep it clean for the animals and those who will be at the shelter in the morning.
- 6. Be kind to animals and people!
